

2011: A Year of Reflection and Progress

This past year has brought lots of changes and accomplishments to our organization. Through the generosity of the Ball Brothers Foundation, we received another grant that has helped us to continue to our mission and vision. For the past two years we have had a strong focus on keeping the Historic Downtown area clean of litter and debris. Through weekly and monthly clean-ups, volunteers have made a significant impact on the Downtown streets, parking lots and green spaces keeping multiple pounds of trash out of storm drains and out of sight.

The 2011 White River Clean-up was a huge success!! 325 volunteers still made it out to clean up 4,800 pounds of trash and 35 tires from the White River in Muncie. A huge number of volunteers were high school age youth representing Muncie Central, Southside, Cowan, the Youth Opportunity Center and the Indiana Academy.

This also was the first official year of our newest program, the Urban Gardening Initiative (UGI) UGI is a network of nine local community gardens working together to share resources to encourage more urban food production. UGI hosted a "how to build a cold frame" miniworkshop using recycled pallets and windows to make vegetables greenhouses to extend the growing season for local gardeners. There has been increasing interest in community gardening locally and UGI is leading the way to see that existing gardens have the resources they need to be successful and that new ones have the help to get started.

In order to have a greater impact in our community, we felt a new website was needed to carry on our message and create a space for the community to share the journey with us. Our new website, www.beautifulmuncie.org, is an outlet of information that highlights the new and exciting things we are doing. Our new website also hosts a community forum page that allows community members to create a profile and join the conversation by sharing experiences, knowledge and resources through categories centered on the core values and programs of our organization. We look forward to the potential this forum can have as a tool for the progression of our organization, which is driven by the local community, members and businesses that supports us.

All of this can be wrapped up in a community celebration, which leads me to our 2nd Annual Oscar Night. Oscar Night is an opportunity for us to recognize and award the doers and contributors of this community, who go above and beyond to beautify and make Muncie a better place for all of us. We do this simultaneously with the Academy Awards and encourage everyone to get clean and beautiful for Muncie Delaware Clean and Beautiful. Oscar awards are given throughout the night to local members and it serves as a great annual fundraiser to support the programs of MDCB.

I am confident that in the months to come you will find a way to join us and get more involved with our organization. 2012—A Year for Celebration

2012 marks the 35th year since the founding of MDCB. As we approach our coral anniversary, we are looking towards the future of the organization and the new opportunities it will bring.

The first major opportunity is that we are in the process of becoming an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful. Many of you will remember the crying Native American commercial from the 8os. KAB is a national organization that focuses on litter prevention, recycling initiatives, and community beautification. They have almost 6oo affiliates across the country that target specific areas, from small towns to entire stages. We will be the newest affiliate, one of only five in the state.


As an affiliate we will be open to numerous opportunities for help from the national organization. We will be eligible for grants to help cover costs. KAB solicits money from national sponsors and distributes that to the affiliates. We will also be up for awards that are given out on a national stage that will recognize our organization and volunteers for all the effort they put forth. In addition, KAB requires us to measure our community cleanliness every year, which will help us to quantify the amount of litter in our community.

By joining forces with a great national organization like Keep America Beautiful, we will be able to better provide cleanups and other programs to our community increasing our PR opportunities and decreasing the amount of funds that we need to raise to keep the organization growing. We will continue our tradition of downtown cleanups, but we hope to expand our services all over Delaware County. Our Urban Gardening Initiative will continue to keep growing into 2012. We have a couple of existing community gardens in the pipeline to join. We will also be helping some dedicated volunteers to create new community gardens all over Delaware County.

We are looking for our community to step up and work with their friends and neighbors to start beautifying our neighborhoods. We are working with the Muncie Sanitary District to increase the number of volunteers working on neighborhood cleanups. In addition to these large, once-a-year cleanups, we are looking for people to adopt a block. Our goal is for every block in Muncie to have a caretaker who will clean up litter in the public spaces.




